To get inspired for the redesign use websites, magazines and social media such as Pinterest, Houzz, and Architectural Digest. Organize your ideas in a binder or on an online idea board. Rank the list by priority and start pricing the desired items.

2 Consider Your Resources

Figure out how much money, time and energy you're willing to dedicate to the project. 3 Set a Budget

4 Sketch It Out

You don't have to be an artist — make a rough layout of the space and sketch in fixtures and storage space you want to include. Measure More

6 Replace the Underlayment
